Call to Order

Mayor Bayless called the meeting to order.

Invocation

Reverend Steve Crews of the Hamlet Church of God of Prophecy offered the invocation.

Adoption of Agenda

Council Members Buie and Martin motioned to adopt the agenda. The motion passed 5-0.

Adoption of Minutes

Minutes to the February 14, 2017, Special Meeting; March 14, 2017- Budget, Regular and Closed Session Meetings were unanimously approved by motions of Council Members Buie and Martin. The motion carried.

Comments from Attendees

None were presented.

Old Business:

Presentation of Service Weapon to Retired Captain Steve Taylor. Mayor Bayless called Steve Taylor to the front and presented the retired HPD Captain with his service weapon. The Mayor thanked Mr. Taylor for his years of service to the City of Hamlet and wished him a great retirement.

New Business:

Public Hearing: The Mayor opened the floor to the hearing. The manager gave a brief summary of the proposed amendments to the sign ordinance. Representatives for Firsthealth were present to make the presentation for the sign ordinance. The new replacement signs will be the same size. There were no other comments and the hearing was closed.

Adoption of Fourth Quarter Budget Amendments.

Mayor Bayless called for questions on the budget amendments presented and there were none. Council Members Martin and Buie motioned to adopt the fourth quarter budget amendments. The motion carried.

Mayoral Proclamation Honoring May 2017 as Older Americans Appreciation Month

The Mayor read the proclamation aloud and presented same to Janet Robertson. Ms. Robertson introduced herself as the new liaison for the Hamlet jurisdiction and the Lumber River Council of Governments.

Other Business:

Manager's Report. Mr. Blanton reported city offices will be closed for Good Friday and said it will not affect the garbage pickup schedule. He stated the Hamlet Tree Board held an Arbor Day celebration recently and did a great job. Mr. Blanton thanked council and staff for their help with the budget preparations and he commended the Hamlet Police Department for their work on a recent drug bust.

- David Lindsey recognized the Seaboard Festival for the cleanup on Front Street. He said he is glad to see the Hamlet and Ellerbe baseball leagues playing together this year. Mr. Lindsey noted he hates the city decided not to accept his property on Jefferson Street for the park.
- Jesse McQueen said he is extremely proud to present Captain Taylor with his service weapon. He wished him well in his retirement.
- Eddie Martin congratulated Captain Taylor on his retirement and thanked him for his years of service.
- Wendy Massagee congratulated and thanked Captain Taylor.
- Johnathan Buie reiterated appreciation to Steve Taylor; he was pleased the city presented the service weapon. Mr. Buie wished all a happy Easter holiday.

Mayor's Comments

The Mayor reiterated the recognition for the Arbor Day Celebration last week. Holy Week services are going on at First Baptist Church and the public is welcome to attend.
